Mr. Iglesias introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Insular Affairs and ordered to be printed

A BILL

To make Puerto Rico an incorporated Territory of the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That the provisions of this Act shall apply to the island of
- 4 Puerto Rico and to the adjacent islands belonging to the
- 5 United States, and waters of those islands; and the name
- 6 Puerto Rico as used in this Act shall be held to include not
- 7 only the island of that name but all the adjacent islands as
- 8 aforesaid.
- 9 Sec. 2. An incorporated Territorial government is es-
- 10 tablished over the island of Puerto Rico, with its capital at
- 11 San Juan, Puerto Rico.

- 1 Sec. 3. All persons who had become citizens of the
- 2 United States in accordance with an Act of Congress, ap-
- 3 proved March 8, 1917, entitled "An Act to provide a civil
- 4 government for Puerto Rico, and for other purposes"; and
- 5 all citizens of the United States who shall reside in the island
- 6 of Puerto Rico for one year shall be citizens of the Territory
- 7 of Puerto Rico.
- 8 Sec. 4. The Constitution and, except as otherwise pro-
- 9 vided, all the laws of the United States, including laws
- 10 carrying general appropriations, which are not locally inap-
- 11 plicable, shall have the same force and effect within the said
- 12 Territory of Puerto Rico as elsewhere in the United States:
- 13 Provided, however, That hereafter all taxes collected under
- 14 the internal-revenue and customs laws of the United States
- 15 in Puerto Rico and on articles produced in Puerto Rico and
- 16 transported to the United States, or consumed in the island,
- 17 shall be deposited in the treasury of Puerto Rico, to be wholly
- 18 devoted for social-security service, education, sanitation, and
- 19 permanent public works of the island as may be prescribed
- 20 by the Legislature of Puerto Rico.
- 21 Sec. 5. Any part or parts of the Act of Congress, ap-
- 22 proved March 2, 1917, entitled "An Act to provide a civil
- 23 government for Puerto Rico", and the laws of Puerto Rico
- 24 not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the United

- 1 States or the provisions of this Act shall continue in force,
- 2 subject to repeal or amendment by the Congress of the
- 3 United States.
